Target Student Population

From the RFP:

"The program is also designed to increase opportunity and access to postsecondary education for academically at-risk, disadvantaged populations of students"

Put another way:

We recruit students, regardless of academic preparation, who, but for NYS P-TECH, would have no post-secondary plans.





At-risk, Disadvantaged Populations - Defined

- Attendance Issues and/or truancy
- Economically Disadvantaged
- English Language Learner (ELL)
- Familial Lack of Academic Achievement
- Individuals with Disabilities
- Unsatisfactory Academic Achievement
- Family Support Issue

NOTE: Students can only enter NYS P-TECH in the 9th grade



Potential Students

- Aim for a heterogeneous group; this is not a traditional Alternative School
- Seek out students where P-TECH can make a difference
 - First generation college goers
 - Middle schoolers with challenges who can't imagine themselves as college material
 - Bored middle schoolers who are ready for a challenge and seeking relevance
 - Students lacking family supports
 - Hands-on learners and those having difficulty with traditional classroom
 - English Language Learners
- The model may be an opportunity for students with an appropriate IEP
 - Make sure the student receives all services in the IEP, including in college courses
 - Identify all services available on campus
 - Coach and support students to self-advocate and navigate the college's offerings

Activities & Events

- Meet with leaders of all participating school districts
- Visit all participating middle schools; meet with Guidance Counselors
- Invite Guidance Counselors and other decision makers for School Tours
 - have a student from their district conduct the tour
- Conduct Open Houses to answer parent and student questions
- For new schools arrange an opportunity to visit an operating NYS P-TECH
- Offer presentations at each middle school for students, parents, faculty
- Make all materials and applications easy to access
- Participate in any career or high school fairs



Match the Message to the Stakeholder: Parents and Students

- No-cost college degree covering textbooks, fees, transportation, etc.
- Public financial aid (TAP and Pell grants) still available for later use
- Work-based learning, first in line for jobs
- No-cost college degree covering textbooks, fees, transportation, etc.
- Additional services and support so students are prepared to succeed in college
- Set Expectations 6 year program and will meet high standard of performance to meet college and career ready benchmarks;
 participate in extended day and summer programming

Public-Private Partnerships for College and Career Success

Match the Message to the Stakeholder: School District Staff

- Opportunity to expand the district's portfolio to meet more students' needs
- Students will count towards the host district's graduation rate
- Students will earn the 2.0 College, Career, and Civic Engagement Rating for Accountability
- Cost effective for Component Districts participating in a BOCES-led program



Match the Message to the Stakeholder: Other Tips

- Listen to questions to shape presentations
- Share success stories from students and testimonials from college and employer partners
- Highlight examples from the host school
- Make it competitive: This is an opportunity and a privilege



Common Questions

- Can students still walk in high school graduation?
 - YES
- Will they be able to participate in extracurricular activities?
 - Depends on the program, but they will have unique access to work-based learning, internships, etc.
- Will they be able to take electives?
 - This program is a guided pathway focused on completing the high school diploma, AAS degree, and workbased learning. There will be options for students to explore individual interests throughout, but not a wide range of electives courses.
- Will they get an Advanced Designation?
 - The AAS degree is much more relevant and valuable in the labor market and in college applications.
- Will they be able to participate in sports?
 - There will be limited opportunities for HS team sports. They will not be eligible for NCAA teams.
- Will their college credits transfer?
 - All college credits will transfer within the SUNY and CUNY systems.
 - If a student changes majors, some courses may count as elective credit but not fulfill requirements.
