2/3 of all job openings require >HS diploma, AA adds 24% to lifetime earnings




97% of new jobs created in the last decade require post-secondary education


Only 35% graduate in 6 years; 50% require remedial courses in college








NYS P-TECH: New Models






STAGES OF DEVELOPMENT: FOCUS ON DESIGN


STAGES OF DEVELOPMENT: FOCUS ON STUDENTS



- To serve as the brain trust and the trusteeship of the NYS P-TECH school
- Evolving Process





Roles And Responsibilities

- Clear Expectations
 - ✓ Meeting Attendance and Participation
 - ✓ Collaborative Agenda and Goals Setting
 - ✓ Staff Assignment
 - ✓ Resource Allocation
 - -- Decision Making Authority
- Benchmarks
 - ✓ Structure
 - ✓ Skills Map
 - ✓ SYISS
 - ✓ Principal Selection
 - ✓ Student Recruitment



Meetings

- Schedule Regular Meetings
 - ✓ Decision-Makers from each Partner meet twice/year
 - ✓ Steering Committee should meet monthly
 - ✓ Scheduling will be a challenge, but don't lose momentum
- Circulate Agenda in Advance
- Provide Adequate Time for Critical Decisions



Decision-Making

- Establish a Process Upfront; don't wait for a problem
- Provide sufficient time to consider the issues and gather information
- Encourage everyone to share their recommendations and concerns
- Aim for consensus the solution everyone agrees will work even if it's not everyone's first choice
- Policy and regulations may limit your options; Tradition and Legacy need not interfere with innovation
- Concern for student success over-rides all other issues
